(Site 1) King's Cross Station: Platform 9¾ and several other interior station film sites, as well as exterior station film sites

(Site 2) The London Zoo: the Reptile House where Little Whinging Zoo scenes were filmed for Sorcerer's Stone

(Site 3) The British Museum: see the Lewis Chessmen that Harry and Ron's chess set was modeled after

(Site 4) Lincoln's Inn Fields: Number 12 Grimmauld Place exterior film site

(Site 5) Australia House: where Gringotts Bank interior scenes were filmed

(Site 6) St. Paul's Cathedral: the geometric staircase filmed for Prisoner of Azkaban

(Site 7) The London Bridges Harry Potter traversed by Knight Bus or Broomstick

(Site 8) Borough Market; 7 Stoney Street: Leaky Cauldron & Diagon Alley film sites

(Site 9) Leadenhall Market; 42 Bull's Head Passage: another Leaky Cauldron & Diagon Alley film site

(Site 10) Westminster Underground Station: Harry and Mr. Weasley were filmed using this station when traveling to Harry's Ministry of Magic hearing

8 Harry Potter Places in South Central England

(Site 12) Surrey, Surbiton Train Station: a film site for the Half-Blood Prince and both Deathly Hallows movies

(Site 13) East Sussex, Eastbourne; Beachy Head and Seven Sisters: background landscapes for Goblet of Fire's Tent City and Quidditch World Cup Stadium were filmed here

(Site 14) Middlesex, Harrow School: Sorcerer's Stone magic lessons were filmed in The Fourth Form Room, the best-preserved 17th century classroom in Britain

(Site 15) Hertfordshire, Little Gaddesden; Ashridge Park: a Goblet of Fire film site

(Site 16) Buckinghamshire, Iver; Black Park: where Forbidden Forrest scenes have been filmed, and where the Hagrid's Hut set was built for movies 1, 2, and 4

(Site 17) Berkshire, Bracknell, Martin's Heron; #12 Picket Post Close: where exterior shots of the Dursley's house at #4 Privet Drive were filmed

(Site 18) Berkshire & Surrey, Virginia Water Lake: a film site for many Hippogriff and Thestral scenes (among others)

(Site 19) Wiltshire, Lacock: This medieval village inspired Rowling's descriptions of Godric's Hollow, where Harry's parents lived before they were murdered. Thus, Half-Blood Prince and Deathly Hallows scenes were filmed here.

(Site 20) Lacock Abbey: interior scenes of Hogwarts School for movies 1, 2, 6 and 7 were filmed here; as were the classrooms of McGonagall, Snape, and Quirrell

(Site 21) Lacock; The Angel: scenes for Half-Blood Prince were filmed in this hotel

(Site 22) Lacock, Cantax Hill: Half-Blood Prince scenes were filmed here.

The Old Rectory on Cantax Hill is a B&B and a film site for Draco Malfoy's ancestral home, Malfoy Manor, in Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows.

(Site 23) Gloucestershire; Gloucester Cathedral: the film site for many Hogwarts School exterior scenes, as well as the Gryffindor dormitory scenes

(Site 24) Duke Humfrey's Library; Located Within Oxford University's Bodleian Library: where Hogwarts' Library scenes were filmed

(Site 25) Oxford University's Divinity School: where the Hogwarts School "sanatorium" (hospital) scenes were filmed

(Site 26) Christ Church College: Professor McGonagall was filmed greeting first-year students on the 16th century staircase that leads up to the Great Hall; and the Great Hall was exactly replicated in a studio to film Hogwarts Hall scenes

(Site 27) New College Cloisters: many movie scenes were filmed here, including the memorable Goblet of Fire scene where Malfoy is turned into a ferret

(Site 28) Oxfordshire, Woodstock; Blenheim Palace: a film site for Order of the Phoenix forest and lake-side scenes

(Site 32) The Elephant House Café: where JK Rowling finished writing her first novel, *Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone*, in 1995

(Site 33) The Balmoral Hotel: where JK Rowling finished her final Harry Potter novel, *Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows*, in room #652, on January 11th, 2007

18 Harry Potter Places Near Fort William

(Site 34) Glencoe, Clachaig Inn: four prominent Prisoner of Azkaban film sets were built very near to this Inn (familiar landscapes remain even though the sets were destroyed); scenes for Harry Potter movies 4, 5, 6, and 7 also were filmed nearby

(Site 35) Glen Etive: some Order of the Phoenix scenes were filmed here.

(Site 36) Glen Nevis and Steall Falls: Quidditch World Cup and Tri-Wizard Tournament background landscapes were filmed here

(Site 37) Loch Arkaig: film site of Half-Blood Prince aerial shots and cave scenes

(Site 38) Loch Shiel: a frequent Hogwarts' Lake filming location

(Site 39) West Highland Railway: Between May and October you can personally experience Harry Potter's train journey to Hogwarts, by boarding the train that

starred as the Hogwarts Express – the Jacobite Steam Train – for a round-trip journey between Fort William and Malliag. The route includes Glenfinnan Viaduct, the very familiar bridge traversed by the Hogwarts Express enroute to Hogwarts. (Site 40) Glenfinnan Viaduct: directions for independently visiting the iconic bridge traversed by the Hogwarts Express in several Harry Potter movies

GLOSSARY of Harry Potter Terms Used in the
A Novel Holiday Proposal's Sample Outline (Table of Contents)

- 1 Prior Incantato: an incantation that causes a wand to reveal the most recent spells it has performed
- 2 The Sorting Hat: the hat that decides which Hogwarts House each student is assigned to
- 3 LUMOS!: an incantation that causes the user's wand to light up
- 4 Specialis Revelio!: a spell used to reveal any special bewitching or hexing that has been placed on an object
- 5 Quick-Quill: a "Quick-Quotes Quill" is a pen commonly used by tabloid journalists, that – all on its own! – quickly composes and writes text for an article
- 6 Kwikspell: a correspondence course in beginner's magic for *Squibs* (magicians who have little magical powers)
- 7 Huffandpuff: a play on "Hufflepuff House" (one of Hogwarts' four student Houses)
- 8 Padfoot: Sirius Black's nickname
- 9 Pensieve: a device where sliver *threads* containing memories plucked from someone's brain are stored; Professor Dumbledore's pensieve was a stone basin filled with shiny liquid
- 10 Portkey: an object that transports wizards to a prearranged place (you touch it to be magically transported to the destination)
- 11 The Burrow: the home of Ron Weasley's family
- 12 The Leaky Cauldron: the Wizarding pub and boarding house through which witches and wizards gain access to *Diagon Alley*
- 13 Malfoy Manor: the grand Manor House that is the ancestral home of Draco Malfoy's family
- 14 Snitch-Seeking: a "Seeker" is the Quidditch player who seeks for and tries to catch the *Golden Snitch* (a small, silver-winged, golden ball)
- 15 O.W.L.s: Ordinary Wizarding Levels; standard-level magical knowledge examinations
- 16 N.E.W.T.s: Nastily Exhausting Wizarding Tests; higher-level magical knowledge examinations

- 17 Side-Along Apparations: Side-Along Apparation is when someone cannot *Apparate* (magically transport their body to another location in an instant) on their own because they're underage or inept, and must "hitch a ride" by hanging on to someone who *can* Apparate
- 18 ENERVATE!: a spell for reviving something – not to be confused with the *Muggle* (non-magical person) usage of the term, where *enervate* means to make someone weaker
- 19 Horcrux: an object in which a person has concealed part of their soul
